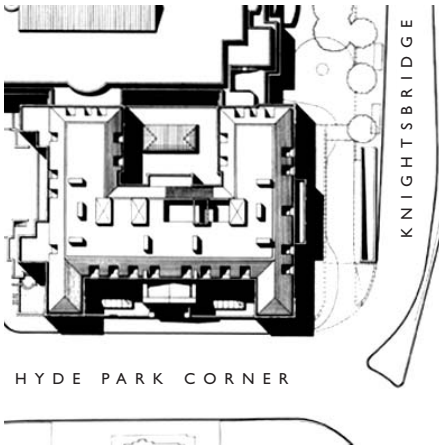

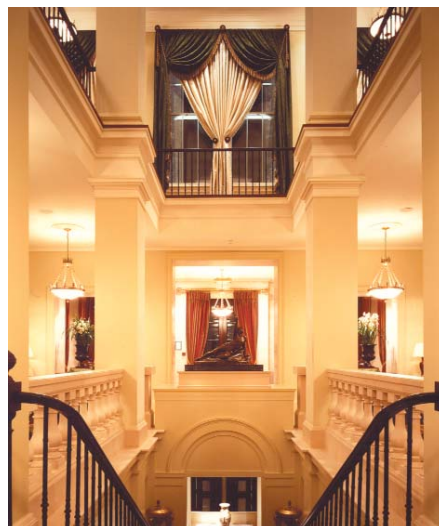
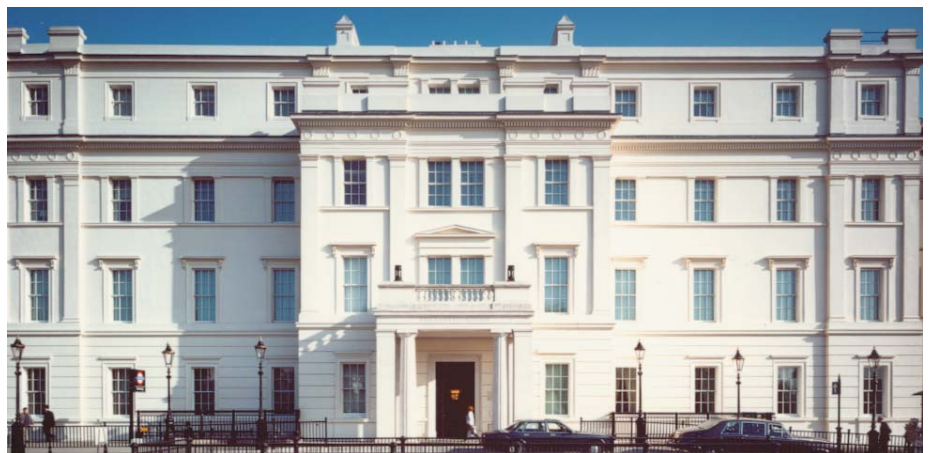
## THE LANESBOROUGH HOTEL, LONDON SW1

The conversion of William Wilkins' derelict and vacated St George's Hospital, built in 1830, into a luxury landmark hotel. Planning permission was obtained in only nine weeks achieved by careful consultation with English Heritage, Royal Fine Arts Commission, Westminster City Council and local residents.

Listed Building Consent required painstaking research and design and carefully monitored execution. Original decorative elements have been retained and repaired using traditional methods. Wilkins' own drawings were consulted for the replacement of windows. The interior was largely rebuilt following the cellular configuration of the wards and encompassing the original staircases and halls with the main entrance relocated to Knightsbridge.

The hotel has 95 luxury rooms and prestigious restaurants, bars, banqueting rooms and lounges.

In 1992, The Lanesborough Hotel won the Westminster Society Architectural Award for the best refurbishment in the City of Westminster and was also joint runner-up in the Mansell Refurbishment Design Award.
